

Australian Disaster Resilience Knowledge Hub Contributors' guidelines:

Overview

The Australian Disaster Resilience Knowledge Hub (the 'Knowledge Hub') is a national, open-source platform that supports and informs policy, decision making and contemporary good practice in disaster resilience. The Knowledge Hub highlights current and emerging themes in the resilience sector, linking national guidelines with research and fostering collaboration among leading agencies and organisations. The Knowledge Hub also houses information on historical Australian disasters and relevant jurisdictional, national and international frameworks for resilience.

The Knowledge Hub is managed by the Australian Institute for Disaster Resilience (AIDR) on behalf of Emergency Management Australia.

Core principles

Content on the Knowledge Hub is:

- relevant to the disaster resilience sector and framed through a disaster resilience lens
- authoritative and of national significance or interest
- derived from or applicable to an Australian/Australasian context
- constructive and not discriminatory or offensive in nature
- accessible, coherent and professionally presented.

Content guidance

Each submission to the Knowledge Hub is individually assessed in accordance with the core principles and AIDR Websites Editorial Committee processes. While not an exhaustive list, the following types of content are encouraged as submissions:

- contemporary content pertaining to a thematic collection e.g. recovery
- frameworks, research and reports relevant to resilience at a national level
- content that enhances or develops historical disaster event records.

Australian and international organisations active in the disaster resilience space are invited to submit proposals to AIDR for special collections profiling relevant research and/or practice.

Contribution requirements

Contributors will be asked to supply the following information; bolded items are mandatory for submission:

- **name**
- organisation(s)
- **sector**
- **contact email**
- contact phone
- **a description of the resource**
- the theme(s) the resource relates to
- whether the resource relates to a specific disaster event
- whether the resource is intended for publication in the National Recovery Monitoring & Evaluation Database
- Relevant URLs where the resource is already published online
- Files/images with appropriate **copyright authorisation** and acknowledgement information where the resource is not currently published online
