Event overview:

The Disaster Resilient Australia New Zealand School Education Network (DRANZSEN) consists of representatives from education and emergency services, NGOs, universities, local government and community groups. Participants at this event will explore effective models of disaster resilience education (DRE) to reduce risk and strengthen communities, with a focus on youth voice and participation.

- youth perspectives on climate change and disaster risk
- youth resilience and agency in the context of drought and COVID-19
- the Queensland Virtual Stem Academy
- youth leadership in disaster resilience.

- provide a forum for schools, emergency management agencies and community organisations in the network to share knowledge, good practice and strategic objectives related to DRE
- facilitate networking and collaboration between stakeholders in the design and delivery of new DRE initiatives.
